

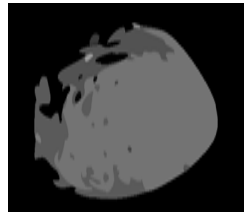

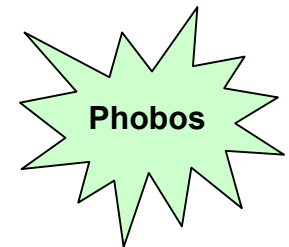


Mars
